According to Confidential Informant meetings of the b2 Communist Party are being held at the home of b7C and according to the informant subject EDNA b7D CRIFFIN has been very enthusiastic in her activities relative to the Communist Party in Des Moines. The informant stated that EDNA GRIFFIN, due to her position as secretary and treasurer of the Des Moines branch of the Party, corresponds with the Communist Party District Headquarters in Omaha. He further advised that in the event records are kept relative to membership in the Communist Party she would have those cards in her possession at her home. Enclosed herewith are requests for Security Index Cards to be made on each of the captioned subjects. Active investigation is being conducted relative to the captioned subjects and a report reflecting their activities will be subjitted to the Bureau in the near future. 53 MM 27 1013



The same informant furnished a copy of the letter forwarded to the Communist Party members in District 32 by WARREN BATTERSON, District Secretary of District 32. This copy was apparently forwarded to the New York Office of the Communist Party in order to inform the New York Office as regards the activities in District 32. This copy, dated December 30, 1947, with return address of Post Office Box 445, Omaha, Nebraska, advises the various members (names not set out) that the Nebraska-Iowa-Kansas District Communist Party Convention would be held on January 11, 1948, at 10:00 A.M. in Des Moines, Iowa; that the meeting place could be obtained by telephoning EINA GRIFFIN, 2-6422, at 1108 Third Street, Des Moines, Iowa. Both of these communications have been forwarded to the Omaha Division and are being retained in the Omaha Case File on the instant matter. Through the assistance of Dean GEORGE BEERY, Drake University, it was ascertained that EDNA MAY GRIFFIN is a Graduate Student of Drake University and is pursuing the courses of English and Education. Her transcript of record at Drake University indicates that she was born October 23, 1909 in Massachusetts. She graduated from Lenox, Massachusetts, High School and attended Fiske University at Nashville, Tennessee, from (2) 1928 to 1933, graduating with a B.A. Degree. Her maiden name is EDNA MAY WILLIAMS, According to the transcript, she also attended Pittsfield High" School, Pittsfield, Massachusetts, from 1923 to 1926. STANLEY GRIFFIN, on October 26, 1946, when registering for the purpose of voting at Des Moines, Iowa, indicated that he was born on February 9, 1913, in North Carolina. He also indicated that he had been resident of the United States for life. As previously indicated, the subjects, both of whom are negroes, reside at 1108 Third Street. From available information, it is believed that the GRIFFINS came to Des Moines, Iowa, in 1946 and that EDNA entered Drake University as a Graduate Student in February of 1948. advises that STANIEY, a student at the Still College of Osteopathy, will probably complete his course within a short period and will then enter into a one year period of internship and that he intends to establish his practice in Des Moines, Iowa.



The meeting was held under the name of "The Committee for ett Understanding." The discussion at this meeting was devoted mattly to encouraging the delegates to work for the Third Party Movement. (WALIACE). Also, to en courage people to join the Progressive Citizens of America and contribute money to the campaign. The details of this District meeting have been reported by the Omaha Office in the case entitled "COMMUNIST PARTY, USA, DISTRICT #32, OMAHA FIELD DIVISION." also advised that EINA GRIFFIN, who is also Secretary and Treasurer of the Des Moines Branch of the Communist Party, USA, b7C b7D arranged for a meeting to be held at the Crocker Branch of the YMCA, 14th and School Streets, Des Moines, Iowa, in order to raise funds for the defense of b7C According to this meeting was not held, however. March 13, 1948, however, at the Crocker Branch of the YMCA a meeting b2 was held with the purpose in mind of raising funds for the defense of b7D ROSA LEE INGRAM, negress, and her two sons upon whom the death sentence was imposed by Schley County, Georgia, Jury. STANLEY GRIFFIN was not present at this meeting but EDNA GRIFFIN, the subject, sponsored the meeting and it was at her instigation that both Communist Party members in Des Moines, should be expelled from the Party because he returned to work during the strike at the Iowa Packing Company, Des Moines, Iowa, before the striking members of the United Packing workers of America - CIO had agreed to return. had returned to work prior to the termination of the strike. EDNA GRIFFIN has also been a frequent visitor at the home of are members of the Communist Party. also advised that MARREN BATTERSON, Chairman of the Communist Party, USA, District #32, has been a frequent visitor at the home of FDNA GRIFFIN in Des Moines, Iowa. advised that EDNA CRIFFIN is no longer a student at Drake University and is now a housewife. These two witnesses were JOHN BIBBS, 1026 16th Street, and Mrs. STANLEY GRIFFIN, 1108 3rd Street, Des Moines, Iowa. BIBBS was the complainant in an action against MAURICE KATZ, Manager of the Katz Drug Store, Des Moines, Iowa, in which Mrs. GRIFFIN, JOHN BIBBS, and LEONARD HUDSON, all Negroes, were refused counter service on July 7, 1948. Both BIBBS and GRIFFIN later testified that they were members of the Progressive Party supporting HENRY A. WALLACE for president. Mrs. GRIFFIN testified that she, BIBPS and HUDSON, of 779 loth Street, another complainant, picketed the store with Progressive Party members on several successive Saturdays after they were refused counter service at the Katz Drug Store. As a result of this trial MAURICE KATZ was found guilty on October 7, 1948 in Municipal Court on a charge of violating the Iowa Civil Rights Law. The penalty is not more than \$100.00 fine or thirty days in the County Jail. As a result of this suit subject received a verdict of \$1.00. PAUL STEVENSON, Kansas City, Missouri, defending attorney for KATZ during the latter trial, contended that the whole incident was consummated in the name of the Progressive Party and that its purpose was to stir up a racial issue in Des Moines. The subject denied participating in the picket line, but admitted that she was there during the picketing. She claimed she was bringing the action for herself and for other members of the negro race. Confidential Informant a reliable source, advised that the subject was known to have said that she was very happy over winning the Civil Rights case against the Katz Drug Company. She also advised that WARREN BATTERSON, District 32 Organizer, Communist Party, USA, had asked her why she did not hold more CP meetings in Des Moines and had also informed her that he was going to be in more frequent contact with the Des Moines party in the future. subject was also contacting members of the CP in Des Moines asking for contributions to be sent to New York as bail money for the eleven Communists convicted in the New York trial. also advised that on October 29, 1949, a birthday party in honor of the subject was held in her home at 1108 Third Street, Des Moines. There were several members of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People present, as well as WARREN BATTERSON and CHARLES HOWARD.
